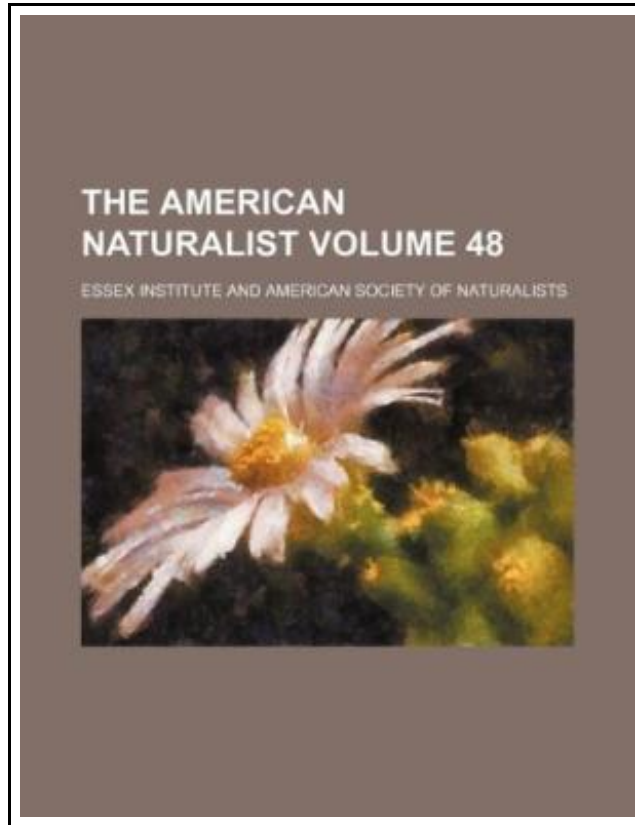

SHORTER ARTICLES AND DISCUSSION NABOURSS GRASSHOPPERS, MULTIPLE ALLELOMORPHISM, LINKAGE AND MISLEADING TERMINOLOGIES IN GENETICS In a review of Nabourss breeding experiments with grasshoppers, 1 Mr. Dexter makes a distinction between an interpretation of Nabourss and his own, where I fail to see a difference except in terminology. This is so typical of much recent Mendelian work that I am tempted to call attention to it. Nabours describes a cross between a female with characters BI and a male with characters CE and comments on the production of an individual with characters BEL He says, as quoted, that the female parent gave at least one gamete containing the factors for the patterns of both her parents (7 and 7) and that this double character gamete was fertilized by one of the E gametes which came from the CE male. Dexter prefers to call the supposed exceptional BI gamete of Nabours Bcel, and the supposed E sperm which fertilized it bcEi, stating that Nabourss terminology would involve multiple allelomorphism, his own linkage. (Nabours uses, I think, neither expression.) Now what is the difference between the two interpretations Is it anything but verbal Is there anything significant in the small letters which Dexter has added to Nabourss formulae If so, what is their significance Do they mean any more than the extra zeros in the expression 1. 000 as compared with 1. 01 Dexter proposes an experimental test,...
